


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On the Cover: The cover image by John Verdi titled "Martigny France" won 4th Place during the February Unlimited Geometric Shapes Digital competition.


The deadline for bringing in your winning prints for the EOY Contest is April 24.

"Caverns in the Clouds"

Support our very own club member Ryan Maurer upcoming self-published book "Caverns in the Clouds".

On February 4, 2025, Pennsylvania Governor Josh Shapiro announced that Laurel Caverns would become the Commonwealth's 125th - and first underground - state park! What a time to release *Caverns in the Clouds*: the seminal work about this hidden marvel. Beneath the slopes of Chestnut Ridge in the heart of southwestern Pennsylvania lies a secret: a cave over 4 miles long plunges nearly 500 feet with passages the size of subway. First discovered in the late-1700s, this natural marvel has become a significant part of the state's geologic and cultural heritage. This book contains over 200 pages of text, full color photographs, and drawings to bring the story of Laurel Caverns to life!

Charles is a photographer, physicist, and woodworker fascinated by the vast and intricate details of the natural world.

Today, Charles passion lies in capturing the grandeur of landscapes and the hidden details of nature through his travels across the globe. From the rugged coastlines of the Lake Tahoe to the vast deserts of the American Southwest, from the aurora-lit skies of Iceland to the serene beaches of Southeast Asia, I seek out the most breathtaking and remote locations to share through my lens.

Charles finds peace and serenity in his macrophotography strolls through gardens and wetlands, uncovering the delicate details often overlooked in our fast-paced world.


When the moon cycle aligns with clear skies, he chases the darkest nights to photograph the cosmos—standing beneath the Milky Way evokes a sense of wonder, reminding him of both the vastness of the universe and our small yet meaningful place within it.

The focus of his talk will be the post processing of those Milky Way photos dditing Milky Way RAW files in Lightroom/Adobe Camera Raw.

Charles resides in Annapolis, MD, next to the Chesapeake Bay, and spend part of the year in Carnelian Bay, CA, on Lake Tahoe—two places that continuously inspire his photography. Whether capturing sweeping landscapes or intricate natural textures, he strives to reveal the beauty that surrounds us, both near and far.

Program - Michael Oberman - Wildlife and Nature

Please join the Arundel Camera Club at 7pm on April 17th in person at the <u>Severna Park Baptist Church</u> or on <u>FaceBook Live</u> for a program by Michael Oberman on "Wildlife and Nature."

Michael's interest in photography began when he was a music columnist at the Washington Star newspaper. Writing a weekly interview column for six years, Michael interviewed over 300 artists including Jim Morrison, Janis Joplin, David Bowie, James Brown...in total, a veritable Who's Who of the music world. There were times when there were no photographers available to accompany him on assignments...so Michael brought his own Nikon with him. When Michael left the Star to work in the music industry he stored away his camera gear. Twenty years ago, on a trip to New Mexico, Michael switched from film to digital photography.

Since that time, Michael has taken over one million photographs...mainly nature but including landscapes, architecture, people, cityscapes and much more.

Michael's photographs are on permanent display in **U.S. National Parks** including **Steigerwald** (overlooking the Columbia River Gorge) and **Modoc** (on a trailhead in the Sierra Nevadas). The Utah Museum of Natural History has one of his photographs on permanent display in its at the entrance to its "Life" exhibit.

Six of Michael's photos toured U.S. and Canadian museums for five years in an exhibit called "Imaginate"...under the auspices of the Ontario Science Centre in Toronto (where the same six photos are on permanent display).

His first book, <u>"Fast Forward, Play, and Rewind,"</u> was published in 2020. His photographs have also appeared in publications including: Parade Magazine, The London Daily Mirror, The Baltimore Sun, Motoring and Leisure (Great Britain), Why Men Make Bad Pets (book), The Lotus: Know It and Grow It (book), Middle School textbooks in Israel, and Elementary School textbooks in Malaysia. Michael has exhibited at: Circle Gallery (Annapolis), Slayton House Gallery (Columbia, MD), and The Netherlands Pavilion (Expo 2009 in Spain). His nature photographs have also appeared in exhibitions and on web sites in Norway, Germany, China, Thailand, Brazil, Canada...and more.

Michael lives in Columbia Maryland where several times a year he teaches Nature Photography.

Field Trip - Shenks Ferry Wildflower Preserve



Please join the club on our April 20th field trip to photograph wildflowers at the Shenks Ferry Wildflower Preserve. Shenks Ferry is a 92-acre nature preserve along the eastern bank of the Susquehanna River.

Shenks Ferry is renowned for its display of 70 species of wildflowers, especially of spring ephemeral species. wildflowers that bloom annually from late March – early June, peaking in April and May. Wildflowers such as spring beauties, Virginia waterleaf, woodland phlox, wild geranium, and a host of other species throughout the season carpet the forested floor.

The trail starts .2 miles from the parking lot. The one-mile Wildflower Trail is a smooth, relatively flat trail that runs along Grubb Creek, offering experienced and novice hikers alike the opportunity to experience the wildflower season in the spring.

Tip: go early. Parking is limited.

The wildflower preserve is 1 hr 40 min north on the Pennsylvania side of the Susquehanna river. The address is 857 Green Hill Rd S, Conestoga, PA 17516. <u>Click here for directions</u>.

A port-a-john will be available to visitors during peak wildflower season only.

Check for ticks after your visit.

Lancaster County is a Spotted Lanternfly quarantine area. This highly invasive insect is a serious threat to the health of our forests. What you can do to help: Stop the Spread. Look before you leave! Check gear, vehicles, and trailers. Smash them, bash them, kill them dead.

Field Trip - Washington, DC Botanic Gardens



Please join the club on our April 27th field trip to the US Botanic Gardens in Washington D.C. The U.S. Botanic Garden is a living plant museum. Admission is free. No tickets required. The Conservatory features plants from across the United States and around the world ranging from desert plants to tropical forests to orchids.

Photos must be taken with hand-held cameras. For advance permission to use a tripod, please contact Visitor Services Coordinator Victoria Gesell at victoria.gesell@aoc.gov. Permit reservations must be requested at least one week in advance, you may inquire at the visitor desk in the Conservatory when you arrive. Please note that same-day permit requests are not guaranteed.

The Conservatory is open 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. The Conservatory is located at 100 Maryland Ave. SW, Washington, DC 20001.

The gated outdoor gardens ("National Garden") are open 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily. They are adjacent to the Conservatory, with entrances from Independence Avenue, from Maryland Avenue (at 3rd Street) and from the Conservatory Terrace. These outdoor gardens have extended evening hours from April 1 - September 15 each year, staying open until 7:00 p.m. The gated outdoor gardens ("National Garden") are currently closed for updates.

Bartholdi Fountain and Gardens are open from dawn to dusk, daily, including weekends and holidays. They are located across Independence Avenue from the Conservatory, with access from any of the three bordering streets: Independence Avenue, Washington Avenue, or First Street SW.

Metered street parking spaces are available within a few blocks of the U.S. Botanic Garden. The Garden does not have its own parking lot or parking spaces.

The easiest way to reach the Garden by Metrorail is by taking either the Orange, Blue, or Silver line to the Federal Center SW station. Exit the station, walk north (left) along Third Street SW for two blocks, cross Independence Avenue, and continue one more block to Maryland Avenue. Look toward the Capitol and you will see the glass dome of the Conservatory. The Conservatory entrance is on Maryland Avenue.





Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
