





The theme is Open, so anything goes.

The contest is open to both novice and unlimited paid club members. Club members may enter up to three digital images. Images need to be 2048 pixels maximum on the longest side. They should be jpg formatted. The deadline for submissions is noon on Tuesday before the contest.



# Program - Allart Kok - Macro Photography



This presentation is not suitable for audience members who shun crawly critters and tremble in the presence of creatures with hairy bodies, lots of eyes, and six, eight, or even more legs. Wings are optional. Bugs are what this presenter's macro photography is all about.

Macro photography is the most democratic of photographic subjects. It is very accessible: it does not require an expensive macro lens; it does not require travel expenses, being accessible in one's own back yard; and it can reveal alien worlds – many that we might not otherwise notice. It has been said that the joy in life

comes in surprises and, in photographing the smallest living things, we often discover marvelous details that we were unaware of when taking a photo. The macroscopic natural world is an incredible teacher of the intricacies and dynamics of life.

To be sure, this presentation is all about accessing macro photography, whether in a casual or dedicated mode. Bugs are the subject, but you can take the core content and photograph watch gears, coins, eyeballs, bubbles or flowers if you prefer.

Kok has been photographing living things since falling in love with the cicada emergence of 1970. They descended on the Baltimore area in huge numbers, screaming, buzzing and procreating before finally piling up, en masse, against the curbs along the streets as Kok trudged home from school. His father's old 1937 Exacta became his ticket into a life-long appreciation of insects and nature photography. While his career in the biological sciences veered into the biomedical world, a love of nature, most notably that presenting itself in local parks and back yards, has always been sustained. These days while his faithful mutt Boh keeps him hiking in the Maryland hinterlands, Kok always carries full camera gear, including his lovely and talented long armed lens, Bertha. After all, one NEVER knows when or where the winged (or unwinged) jewels of nature will make their appearance, be they arthropod or bird.

# Field Trip - Trains of Western Maryland



In the 125 years of its operation as an independent railroad the Western Maryland built a reputation as a truly "Fast Freight Line." From the laborers on the docks at Port Covington to the top brass, Western Maryland people were noted for their skill in the transportation field and the pride that showed in every aspect of their work. Today, the WM is a fond memory, its remnants serving as important links in the CSX Transportation chain plus various shortline railroads. Its memory survives, however, in the Western Maryland Railway Historical Society, Inc.

The Western Maryland Railway Historical Society was founded in 1967 for the purpose of preserving a portion of America's rich railroad history. We do this by providing programs for community organizations, publishing educational materials drawn from our collection, supporting activities related to railroading, and by making historical records available to groups and individuals researching railroad history. With the cooperation of the Western Maryland Railway, the Society established a Museum in Union Bridge in the buildings that once served as the station, the company's main offices and express shed. The entire complex was built in 1902. The WMRHS is not affiliated with CSX, its predecessors or the Genessee & Wyoming Railroad (Maryland Midland Railway) in any way.

The Museum complex houses our extensive collection of WM artifacts and memorabilia, a voluminous photo archive, archival material directly from the Western Maryland Railway, and an extensive railroader's library featuring historical and technical publications about the WM and other roads of the region. Integral parts of the organization are model railroad layouts.



## 2025-2026 Contest Themes

### October - Macro/Close-Up

The photograph should be taken from a position very near the subject. Generally, this means that the lens should be focused at or near its closest focusing position. The use of screw on close up filters, extension tubes and macro lenses is permitted.

### **December - Abandon/Decay**

Abandoned photography, focuses on capturing images of derelict buildings, abandoned and decaying properties, often highlighting the beauty and stories within these forgotten spaces. Decay can be defined as to decline from a sound or prosperous condition, to fall into ruin, or to decline in health, strength, or vigor. The image should focus on any subject, or subjects, that document or convey the sense of abandonment or decay. The theme is not limited to urban environments.

### February - Water

Water Image must focus on water in any of its many forms, and that form must be composed of actual water. This includes lakes, oceans, beaches, rivers, pools, ponds, waterfalls, fog, steam, ice, ect. Images could include kids playing in water, people walking in the rain, dogs playing in the sprinkler, water splashes or drops, etc.

### **April - Abstract**

This category should include images that are in some way altered from the usual way it is viewed. The photograph can concentrate on color, form, texture, pattern, line or other aspect of the object. The subject of the photograph may be an identifiable object, but should be rendered in a way that the identity of the object is secondary to aspects of form, color (or tone), lines, shapes, or texture. That is, the subject may be recognizable, but the photograph should not be representational. The distinction can be subtle and ultimately will reside with the judge.




























Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
