Draft 2014-2015 Schedule Notes

Baltimore Photo Walk - In lieu of a program on September 10th we will meet in Baltimore at 7:30PM for a evening photo walk. Sunset is around 7:46PM. This is during the week of the Star-Spangled Spectacular. During the day 30 tall ships and Navy ships will be arriving from 9:00AM to 5:00PM. If you want to come early, there will be a Welcome Ceremony from 6:00PM to 7:30PM at the Inner Harbor Amphitheater. We will team up new with seasoned photographers and get a chance at some night photography. This will help club members with the December competition. Bring a tripod. If you don't have one, we will try to loan you one for the walk. We are looking for people to lead this walk.

Annapolis Photo Walk - In lieu of a program on November 5th we will meet in Downtown Annapolis at 7:30PM for a evening photo walk. Although sunset is around 5:00PM, we can get some night shots of Annapolis. Again we will try to team up new with seasoned photographers. Bring a tripod. If you don't have one, we will try to loan you one for the walk. We are looking for people to lead this walk.

Competitions - On the months we will have two contest nights, the first contest will be digital. The second contest of the month will be color and monochrome prints. Jackie Colestock and Russ Zaccari will be working hard to find great competition judges. If you have any suggestions, send them an email at contests@arundelcameraclub.org.

Mini How Tos - On the months we have two contest nights, on the digital contest night we will have a mini how to following the competition. Please send your suggestions for mini how tos to the club officers at officers@arundelcameraclub.org.

Slides - We voted to do away with slide competitions during the business meeting due to lack of participation. We hoped to hold three slides nights during the year in lieu of mini how tos but it looks like the schedule will support two, one in January and one in April. We will not be awarding points. To promote slide photography we look into ordering slide film and making sure everyone who wants to partake has a film camera available to them. Then we will setup some specific events/times to shoot as a club event, offer instruction, arrange for processing, and schedule evenings where we will view them. If participation picks up, then we will consider reinstituting slide competitions in the future.

Table Top Night - We will have a table top night on August 29th. The theme for this table top night will be abstract. This will help club members prepare for the abstract competitions in February.

Star-Spangled Spectacular Field Trip - On Saturday September 14, we will go to Baltimore for the air show by the Blue Angels and fireworks. The fireworks will be a great opportunity to get your tripod out and shoot some night shots for our December competition. Competition Themes / How to Wow Tour

Competition Themes

Open - Anything goes in an open competition.

Environmental Portraits - An environmental portrait is a portrait executed in the subject's usual environment, such as in their home or workplace, and typically illuminates the subject's life and surroundings. By photographing a person in their natural surroundings, it is thought that you will be able to better illuminate their character, and therefore portray the essence of their personality, rather than merely a likeness of their physical features. It is also thought that by photographing a person in their natural surroundings, the subject will be more at ease, and so be more conducive to expressing themselves, as opposed to in a studio, which can be a rather intimidating and artificial experience.

The emphasis should be on creating a portrait that tells the viewer something personal about the subject: their job/hobby/passion/etc. The subject should be engaged, that is they should know that they're having their photograph taken.

How do you know someone is a teacher/lumberjack/civil engineer or loves bicycling/tying fishing flies/building robots/coaching little league baseball? You can take pictures of people riding their bike to work all day, but those aren't environmental portraits. But if you sit the little league coach down in the dugout, have him put on his jacket and/or cap, include his whistle, clipboard, and water bottle, frame the shot to include the bench and dugout steps, and engage him in making some photographs, that's an environmental portrait. Night Photography - You got it. Photographs taken at night. This could include any photograph taken at night, light painting, star trails, etc. These DO NOT INCLUDE sunsets and sunrise shots. Click here for examples of Night Photography.

Wildlife - Any photograph whose main subject is an animal. This includes all kinds of animals including insects, fish, etc.; but not people. This year we decided NOT TO ALLOW domesticated pets, animals in a zoo, or on a farm. Acceptable wildlife shots could range from the wilds of Alaska to the birds and insects in your garden. Abstracts - This category should include images that are in some way altered from the usual way it is viewed. The photograph can concentrate on color, form, texture, pattern, line or other aspect of the object. The subject of the photograph may be an identifiable object, but should be rendered in a way that the identity of the object is secondary to aspects of form, color (or tone), lines, shapes, or texture. That is, the subject may be recognizable, but the photograph should not be representational. The distinction can be subtle, and ultimately will reside with the judge. What I Did This Summer Digital Photo Critique

Our first meeting of the 2014-2015 club year is this coming Wednesday September 4th at 7:30pm in room 114 at the Severna Park High School. We will hold a digital photo critique of **THREE** of your favorite images that demonstrate your work over the summer. This will give club members a chance to catch up, talk about their summer photographic adventures, and hear critiques from other club members.

Even though this is not a contests we will use he same procedures for submissions. Please email your digital entries in by Tuesday night. The contest chairman will confirm receipt of them. Remember that the email address to send your digital entries to is contests@arundelcameraclub.org.

- 1. Please send your images as email attachments.
- 2. Please resize your images to 1024 pixels on the long side.
- 3. Files should be named according to the following convention:
 - A class identifier, 'n' for novice or 'u' for unlimited, should prepend the file name and be followed by an underscore.
 - The image name should appear next. For multi-word titles, it is helpful to either capitalize the first letter of each word or separate each word with an underscore. Although most mechanisms of uploading/transferring/emailing files handle spaces in titles, this is not universal. If you have problems sending files with space-separated titles, try the methods mentioned above instead.
 - An underscore and the owner's first and last initials should follow the title.
 - Finally, make sure the file extension (.jpg) exists.
 - Examples: Here are file name samples using the above convention:

Summer Potluck Picnic

Jackie and Bob Colestock hosted one of our best club picnic ever. We had great weather for a change. The two previous years rain has dampened the event but not this year. Everyone was scrambling to find some shade. We had plenty of good food. A couple club members even got in for swim.

Chip Bulgin eve set up some studio lights for a little off camera strobe and lighting tutorial. Thanks to our patient volunteer model.















Chip used a green gel in combination with the fluorescent white balance setting in the camera to affect the colors of the background. The fluorescent white balance causes the scene to take on a magenta cast. You can see the tint in the sky and also in the water. Using a green gel on the flash causes anything lit by the flash to match up, color balance-wise. So our subject is balanced correctly and appears normal, while anything the flash can't reach takes on a magenta tint.

Chip used a 1/4 CTO (slight orange) gel covering the flash with the white balance set to daylight while the subject is in shade resulting in a cool background and warmed model.








