

Business Meeting Minutes

On May 11, we hosted our annual business meeting. Our president Chip Bulgin presided over the meeting. Our Secretary/Treasurer Jackie Colestock made the agenda and kept records. We had approximately 15 members in attendance.

Miscellanoues

Chris Van Valkenberg made a request that she be allowed to provide refreshments for the judges at the Year End Contest that is being judged this coming Saturday. Members approved.

Finances

Jackie handed out and went over the Year End Cash Flow Sheet and Balance Statement for the club. There were no questions.

Election

The Slate of Officers (Attached) was presented and nominations were asked for from the floor.

Award Revisions

Discussion was about having Novices competing directly with Unlimited during the year and for the Year End awards. There is a feeling among those new to photography that they are not capable of competing at the upper level. With the expressed purpose of increasing Novice participation and retention, the Board proposed increasing the Year End Awards to 8 from the Current 4.

A motion was made and carried to revise the current Year End Rewards and to create an additional four Year End awards starting next Club Year (2016-2017) as follows:

Novice Monochrome Prints	The Margaret H. Bevan Award – Unlimited Monochrome Prints
Novice Color Prints	The John R. Boykin Award – Unlimited Color Prints
Novice Digital Imagery	The Howard L. Penn Award – Unlimited Digital Imagery
The Frederick R. Kelly – Novice Photographer of the Year	Unlimited Photographer of the Year

Naming of the new awards will be considered at a future date.

Business Meeting Minutes (Cont.)

Competition Rules Revisions

Discussion focused on four topics: Merging of Novice and Unlimited during the monthly competitions, revising the definition of Monochrome, adding a statement regarding plagiarism, and clarifying/revising the Club Events competition.

Merging of Novice and Unlimited

The current rules encourage the merge of Novice and Unlimited in the event that there are not a total of 9 images within a category. In the past this has resulted in Novice images being moved up to Unlimited, as Novice has traditionally been where there shortage occurred. Recently, the opposite occurred and Unlimited images were to be moved down to Novice. As per the current rules, the Novices were asked to approve this merge. The request to merge was rejected based upon the perception that the inclusion of the Unlimited images would unfairly penalize the Novice participants.

Discussion continued regarding the minimum number of prints required to hold a competition. The number nine has been used because it was felt that there needed to be at least twice the number of images in the competition as there were ribbons being awarded. The Club awards at least First thru Fourth places, which results in at least 9 images needed for judging.

A motion was made and carried to completely remove the option to merge novice and unlimited in the event that there are not enough images to hold a competition was made and approved.

A motion was made and carried to create a "Mini Competition": Mini-Competition – Five to eight entries by at least three entrants shall constitute a Mini-Competition. The judge shall select only a second and third place photograph.

Definition of Monochrome

There have been a number of misunderstandings over the actual definition of what constitutes a Monochrome image over the past two years. The Board suggested a clarification of the definition as written in the current rules.

A motion was made and carried to accept the Board's revised definition of a Monochrome and the additional definition of palgiarism as follows:

- 3. Photographs made by any recognized photographic process will be acceptable. Recognized processes include, but are not limited to, chemical prints, ink and/or dye-based prints, slides, collage, montage, toning, and the like.
- 4. A monochrome image is defined as having varying shades of no more than one color (various shades of that color from very light to very dark) but it may be any single color. Multi-toned images (various shades of two or more colors) and greyscale images with an added accent color are not acceptable. Monochrome prints which are toned (sepia, selenium, cyanotype, etc.) will be considered monochrome. Prints displaying more than one color must be entered as color prints. In the event of a dispute the Contest Chairman's application of this rule will be final.

Plagiarism

While there have been few incidents of outright plagiarism there have been a few question regarding the lack of a clear definition within the rules. The Board suggested the addition of a definition be added to the current rules.

A motion was made and carried to add the following to the competiton rules:

7. It is unethical, constitutes plagiarism, and often violates copyright law to simply copy an image (even in another medium) that was made by someone else.

Business Meeting Minutes (Cont.)

Club Events Competition

Until recently the Club Events Contest rules had not been formally codified. The listing on the Club web site resulted from an attempt to write down what had "always been done." Discussion included an evaluation of the most recent Club Events Competition. The conversation included different ways to group the images, allowing a different minimum number of images required, and even changing the number and amount of the prize awarded.

A motion was made and carried to increase the number of grand prizes at the Club Events Competition from the current one Year's Membership Dues to the "Best in Show" to two memberships, one for a Novice "Best in Show" and one for Unlimited "Best in Show".

A motion was made and carried to remove the minimum number of images required for any of the categories in the Club Events Competition. "All submitted images shall be judged regardless of the number of submissions. (Points are NOT awarded.)"

Competition Themes

The following themes were suggested and discussed: Humor/Whimsical, Food, From the Kitchen, Halloween, Peeps, *Scapes , Flowers, Decay, Reflections, Living People, Architecture, Cars, Maritime, Machinery, Sunrise/Sunset, RAW Image/S.O.O.C., Fog/Mist, Shadows.

The following four were selected:

- Humor/Whimsical
- From the Kitchen No Food
- *Scapes
- Decay

Solo Photo Book Month 2016 Starts on 1 July

"As Jacob flipped through the pages of the latest copy of LensWork, he thought to himself, I could do that! I just don't get to visit those exotic locals."

How many times have we heard ourselves say that when looking at a photo book or magazine layout? But do we? Do we take the time and effort to pull together a cohesive body of work? To format it into a logical flow? To write some text to bring it all together? The sad answer is that all too often we just don't.

Some of our clubs do a portfolio project (or photo essay) every year, which is a good start. Building that theme-based series of photographs can be daunting. But year after year our club members are able to achieve that goal. This year, why not take it a little farther? Develop a HUGE sense of accomplishment by taking part in **Solo Photo Book Month 2016**. Shoot your photos, write your text and format a great photo book all in a single month.

Challenge yourself to create that PDF book in 31 days. Have the flexibility of picking the best 31 days in July and August for your 'fuzzy month.'

Your photo book can be on any topic you can dream up. Going on vacation to the beach? Won't you have at least 35 images of the fun you have with your family? Attending a photography workshop like Corey Hilz's Butterfiles at Brookside Gardens Workshop? Won't you capture 35 fine images as the Eastern tiger swallowtails alight on lavender? Either is what you need to create your PDF book.








