

Margaret (Holly) Bevan (20 March 2016 - 9 December)



Mike Bevan, Holly's son, contacted us this morning. Holly died this morning (12/09/2017) about 0700. She was 101 years old. She had been in an assisted living for the last three weeks because her condition had deteriorated to where she needed assistance available on a 24 hour basis. Prior to that she had been living at home.

Holly was born March 20, 1916 and turned 101 last March. In 1942, she signed up to join the U.S. Navy WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service). Holly recalled her first night in the Navy. "There were eight women in the room and four of them were named Margaret," she said. The WAVES nicknamed her Holly.

She met her husband Wilbur Bevan at a USO dance when they were both stationed in Corpus Christi, Texas. The couple got married Oct. 27, 1944.

Holly earned a Bachelor of Arts in journalism in 1951. She aspired to be a writer – she wrote a column for her high school newspaper, and used her writing skills to publicize and write newsletters for the clubs she belongs to.

She earned her teaching certificate at the University of Maryland and a Masters degree in education from Johns Hopkins.

Holly and her husband Wilbur shared a love of photography; both belonged to the Arundel Camera Club. Until last year, Holly continued to coordinate publicity for the Arundel Camera Club. If you found your way to ACC via a classified ad in the newspaper, that was from Holly.

You may also have noticed we have two end of year awards named after Holly and Wilbur. The Margaret H. Bevan Award for the Monochrome Prints and The Wilbur R. Bevan Award for the Slides.

January Field Trip - The National Garden D.C.

On Saturday January 13, club members will go to The National Garden which is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily, including all weekends and holidays. It is adjacent to the Conservatory, with entrances from Independence Avenue, from Maryland Avenue (at 3rd Street) and from the Conservatory Terrace.

Parking: Metered street parking spaces are available within a few blocks of the U.S. Botanic Garden. A limited number of accessible spaces are available in front of the Conservatory on Maryland Avenue SW.

Photography: We welcome and encourage personal photography Due to the increased number of visitors to the Garden during Season's Greenings, tripods cannot be used on throughout the run of the exhibit. Visitors are permitted to take photographs of the public areas for personal use only, and must be taken with handheld cameras. Commercial use of such photographs is strictly prohibited.

For permission to use tripods, please reserve a permit in advance by contacting Laura Anthony. Reserved permits are obtained onsite at the Visitor Information Services desk in the Conservatory.

Dining: There are no dining facilities at the U.S. Botanic Garden. The closest dining options are located at the National Museum of the American Indian, the Rayburn or Longworth House Office Buildings or the Capitol Visitor Center. In addition, restaurants can be found on Third Street SW, near the Federal Center SW

metro station.

Admission: Admission to the U.S. Botanic Garden is free. :)







Meeting Nights

The Arundel Camera Club meets every Wednesday evening when school is in session and weather permitting. We only meet if the School is open. Check for school closings at the following link http://www.aacps.org/.

Meetings alternate with programs of informative speakers and photographic competitions. Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. We have competitions for slides, color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
