April 4: Program - Leon Johnson Portrait Photography and Post Processing - Leon was scheduled two weeks ago but cancelled due to weather school closure. He has graciously agreed to come give us a glimpse into his unique style of award winning portrait photography and post processing. He will do a short shoot with the lovely Bridgette VanValkenberg and then show us how he post processes an image.

April 11: Contest - Color & Monochrome Prints - Surrealism - Surreal photography would be more about creating a world or image which goes beyond the physical world as we know it. It usually shows something which would be impossible in real life or tampers with the line defining what is real and what is imaginary. Surreal = beyond the real. Only dues paying members may participate in contests. You may enter three monochrome prints and three color prints. Images must be printed and matted or mounted.



Solarization

Scans of Solarized Prints by Club Member John Milleker, Jr. I asked John if he had any examples of solarized images, so he went into the darkroom and created these for us. According to John "Officially, this is the Sabattier Effect done in darkroom. Solarization is primarily direct exposure in camera to an extremely bright light for extended times. I still call it solarization. People will do things differently, but the steps I used for mine is exposing the paper about a third less, after my shadows show up in developer and right before midtones appear I cover my developer tray (with the print still developing) with a white translucent cover and then turn on my darkroom light for two seconds. I then remove the white cover and vigorously agitate the print. Then stop bath and fixer as normal. To adjust, I can expose the print to light sooner or later in the development process. That'll determine where in the print my solarization effect occurs. I can

then adjust the darkness of the solarization by the amount of time I expose the print to light. "





Solarization

I asked George Smyth of the, Bowie Crofton Camera Club, if he had any examples of Solarization I could use to explain the technique to club members and George scaned and sent me these two images.

The first one is standard Sabatier where I brushed the Dektol onto the print.

The second one, just for the fun of it, I contact printed a Sabatier (different from the other one I sent) to reverse it.

Solarization


Bob Webber created this example of Solarization digitally using a photo editor called Faststone. According to Bob "I converted it to grey scale then used the curve tool. This controls the mapping of camera (input) to viewer image (output) pixels. Normal it is a straight or slightly curved line going from bottom left to top right. To imitate the solarize process I bend the curve into a mangled parabola. Note that both bright and dark camera pixels come out a dark image pixels because the curve folds over.

I suspect that you can do this in photoshop except the control in Photoshop is a little smaller than in Faststone.


Solarize effect is most pronounced when you place the falling slope over the peak in the histogram. That means most of the pixels get the treatment. The falling part of the curve is actually the response for a negative."






