

Hybrid Meetings


We held our first Hybrid meeting on 25 August. These meetings are both in-person and virtual via FaceBook Live broadcast over the Internet.

Join us on 15 September for a presentation by Christine Milleker on Still Life Photography which is the theme for our October contests.

If you saw Chris' presentation on <u>Macro photography</u>, which is still available on YouTube, you know we are in for an informative evening on still life. Chris will go over what still life photography is with examples and demonstrations.

On 29 September we will have a chance to practice at our first tabletop night of the year. The goal is to give everyone a chance to practice their still life photography. Bring your cameras, lights, and stuff to photograph. Several of the more experienced photographers will help set up several stations.

Images must be submitted by noon on the Tuesday prior to the Thursday contest.

We have changed the max size of digital images to 2048 on the long side. Images must be jpg.

Print Contests

After two years of COVID-19 and virtual meetings, PRINT CONTESTS ARE BACK. The first print contest will be 22 September.

Prints must be mounted on material such as a standard print mounting board. The board may be of any color desired by the contestant but may not exceed a size of 20" in its longest dimension. Typically mattes are white or off white. You may use black or a color matte but these may elicit negative feedback from the judge. Matte photo with matte board as if you were going to frame it. Also put a backing board on it to protect your photo and the photos of other photographers in the stack.



The back of the mounting board must be labeled with the contestant's name, image title, category, class, and contest date (month/year). Please put an arrow on the back of the print indicating orientation.

A monochrome image is defined as having varying shades of no more than one color (carious shades of that color from very light to very dark) but it may be any single color. Multi-toned images (various shades of two or more colors) and grayscale images with an added accent color are not acceptable. Monochrome prints which are toned (sepia, selenium, cyanotype, etc.) will be considered monochrome. Prints displaying more than one color must be entered as color prints. In the event of a dispute the Contest Chairman's application of this rule will be final. You may submit up to three monochrome and three color prints per contest.

If your printers have been collecting dust for two years, you may need to buy ink and clean your print heads. Don't forget paper and mats. You may also need to update the software and drivers on your computer. Don't forget to calibrate your monitor. It takes time to print and mat and its best not to put it off.

Printing is harder than digital. While you may get away with lower resolution images for digital you will need a high resolution image for printing.

2022-2023 Contest Themes

Still Life (October)

A photograph of an inanimate object or group of objects arranged as the subject for a picture. It can serve as an exercise in skill and creativity, to show an artist's understanding of composition, his ability to depict color harmony, form, texture, and the effects of light upon the objects. Click here for examples of <u>Still Life</u>.

Windows and Doors (December)

A photograph where the primary subject consists of Windows and/or Doors. This could be a classical photograph of the door at the entry to a building or maybe decorated for Christmas. Old doors have lots of character. Like those from abandoned or historical buildings. Doors can be open or shut providing many composition options looking through the door. Windows similarly show character and often have reflections or provide the opportunity to peek within. Click here for example photographs of Windows and Doors.

Glass (February)

A photograph where the primary subject is made of glass. Photographing glass can be challenging due to glare from unwanted or uncontrolled highlights. Techniques like dark field lighting and light field lighting can give definition to the rims/edges of glass. Another interesting property of glass is refraction of light viewed through glass. Many commercial photographs are of glass like wine, beer, or perfume bottles. You can even try photographs of shattering or broken glass but be careful. Click here for example photographs of Glass.

Looks Like a Painting (April)

A photograph that appears to be a painting. This effect could be achieved in camera or through post processing techniques. We have all seen photographs that when first viewed appeared to be a painting. This can be accomplished through composition, costume selection, poses, colors. Another option that requires less creativity is to use filters in your favorite photo editing software to achieve the effect. Click here for example photographs that Looks Like a Painting.

Meetings are open to the public, but only dues paying members may enter competitions and participate in critiques. Meetings alternate between programs of informative speakers, photographic assignments, and photographic competitions. Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. Currently we are only holding digital competitions. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet. The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
