Glass (February)

A photograph where the primary subject is made of glass. Photographing glass can be challenging due to glare from unwanted or uncontrolled highlights. Techniques like dark field lighting and light field lighting can give definition to the rims/edges of glass. Another interesting property of glass is refraction of light viewed through glass. Many commercial photographs are of glass like wine, beer, or perfume bottles. You can even try photographs of shattering or broken glass but be careful. Click here for example photographs of Glass.

Looks Like a Painting (April)

A photograph that appears to be a painting. This effect could be achieved in camera or through post processing techniques. We have all seen photographs that when first viewed appeared to be a painting. This can be accomplished through composition, costume selection, poses, colors. 

Interview with Newsletter Editor Mike Thomas



John: During our Holiday Party I had the pleasure of presenting our Newsletter Editor, Mike Thomas with a certificate of recognition on behalf of myself, the officers and members of the Arundel Camera Club. This certificate was to show appreciation in Mike's commitment in creating what I feel is one of the best looking camera club newsletters I've ever seen. He's worked tirelessly highlighting photographic achievements of our members, but now it's time to highlight our amazing Newsletter Editor! Thanks for your hard work and dedication to this amazing publication!

John: How long have you been the newsletter editor for the Arundel Camera Club and how did you get started?

Mike: The first newsletter I published for the club was May 2010, almost 13 years ago, for a total of 145 newsletters. This was a special issue commemorating the loss of our long-time club president Howard Penn.

John: What skills are required for creating such a great newsletter and what experiences did you bring to the role that made it easier?

Mike: Staying organized is important. Persistence nagging club members for input also helps. I'm always working a month in advance. By the time I publish the monthly newsletter, I have already drafted the newsletter for next month. When I started, I had no idea how to create the newsletter. I copied the format of the award winning Bowie-Crofton Camera Club Newsletter.

John: How has the newsletter changed over the years to keep up with technology?

Mike: At first I used Adobe InDesign which now has a monthly licensing fee. A couple years ago I switched to Google Slides, a free online competitor to PowerPoint. Now our newsletters are stored online in a Google cloud and I can share and collaborate with other club members online. Our club website is also better able to maintain a searchable archive of all of our newsletters creating a more persistent club history.

Mike: As more of our club members have become computer savvy and have smartphones, we stopped distributing a printed copy of the newsletter via postal mail and only share the online version. If you look at the old format of our newsletter it was clearly focused on a 8.5" x 11" portrait orientation for printing. I later changed the format to a landscape format that is better suited for online viewing.

Interview with Newsletter Editor Mike Thomas

John: What's the hardest part of creating the newsletter each month?

Mike: Content, content, content. I'm only one person and I have a day job, so coming up with content can be challenging. I am always looking for events, announcements, how-to articles, and photo opportunities to put in the newsletter. I am also constantly soliciting photos from club events like field trips, picnics, banquets, tabletop nights, portrait nights, etc. Most importantly I need club members to send me digital copies of their winning prints each month so I can highlight their work by publishing them in the newsletter.

John: What other roles do you have in the club?

Mike: Right now I also manage the website. Once I got the website up and running it hasn't been too hard but it does require constant maintenance. I have evolved the website to have new features over time. A couple years ago I was able to add an online membership registration. Most recently I add the ability to upload our images for the digital contest. This was necessitated when Google and Microsoft started blocking the email contest submissions as spam. Real fun happens when the website crashes and I have to drop everything to diagnose and fix. I hope once we resolve our banking issues and our non-profit status, I will be able to add an option to pay our dues electronically.

Mike: I have also served as the contest chairman and the program chairman.

John: Do you have an issue of the newsletter that you are particularly proud of or had the most fun creating?

Mike: Oh that's a great question. Yes I do. The issues highlighting our wonderful club members who have passed away are some of my favorites. I feel like I am preserving their club legacy. 





Meetings are open to the public, but only dues paying members may enter competitions and participate in critiques. Meetings alternate between programs of informative speakers, photographic assignments, and photographic competitions. Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet. The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
