


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On the Cover: The cover image by Tommy Atchison titled "3 Glass Marble Light" won 3rd Place in the February novice digital contest.


### **Maryland Zoo Monthly Photo Contest**

ACC: How long have you been into photography?

## Looks Like a Painting

Last week I asked through the email list for members' thoughts on the upcoming contest theme of "Looks Like a Painting" and I received some great thoughts! I'm happy to hear that this theme has given us an opportunity to stretch some of our creative muscles.

I'm excited about the theme and happy that others are too. But keep in mind that even though Mike has given a great definition to us and the judge on what "Looks Like a Painting" should be. At the end of the day, it's all going to be in the eye of the beholder.

Mike's definition is: A photograph that appears to be a painting. This effect could be achieved in camera or through post processing techniques. We have all seen photographs that when first viewed appeared to be a painting. This can be accomplished through composition, costume selection, poses, colors. Another option that requires less creativity is to use filters in your favorite photo editing software to achieve the effect.

Below are some of the thoughts of your fellow members on the theme and how they intend to tackle it. I'm really excited to see what everyone comes up with! **Andrea writes:** I have yet to compete with this club, but might this time. This is a great theme. I am thinking of intentional Camera motion and in camera multiple exposure, as well as textures and filters.

**Debbie writes:** I have this one photograph that, every time someone looks at it, they remark that it looks "painterly". Maybe I'll enter that one? I also thought I might give a go at some of the filters which often turn judges off. Now might be the time..

**Doug writes:** It's not what we are going to do to make our images look like a painting, it is what the heck does look like a painting mean? And the worst of it is that no matter how much discussion we have here, the judges are going to do whatever they feel like with it. That makes it a total crapshoot.

I'm choosing to go down the Western Impressionist road. Strong colors, a sense of light and atmosphere. All I'm really doing post production wise is pushing color intensity and contrast.

(John adds: It's likely going to be a crapshoot, and I think that's what is going to make this one exciting!)

Clarence writes: I started out as a painter so this theme excites me. I later began hand coloring photographic images. For those who are serious about the topic, they should obtain one of Theresa Airey's books and see how she handles the approach. Theresa lives in Hampton and would be a good judge but I'm not sure she is judging anymore.

In my case, I'm not trying to choose images that look like a painting but rather images that I think could be a starting point. It's a little like Photoshop but because of the time involved in the process, there becomes an intimacy with the print that exceeds the touch of a mouse.

**Tammi writes:** I like creating abstracts. I will look for a photo I have taken with strong patterns and contrasting colors and modify it with a smartphone app. Here is a list of some smart phone apps that can be used to fit the theme.

BeFunky, GoArt, Tangled FX, Prisma, PicsArt, Brushstroke, Portrait Painter, Adobe PaintCan, Waterlouge, Glaze, I-Colorama, Distressed FX, Format, Oilli (John adds: What a great list Tammi, for others our wonderful speaker Lori Lankford gave us a great presentation for our February 16th, 2023 meeting. Be sure to watch that if you missed it!)

**Greg writes:** I'm not into composites, which I think will dominate the competition, but I intend to have a few entries nonetheless. I have one photo that I think will bring a smile to faces (which the "Glass" photo of all our lenses was meant to do!).



Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet. The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
