### Program - Cheryl Kerr - Night Photography



Please join us on Thursday 7 March at 7:00PM at the Severna Park Baptist Church or on FaceBook Live for a program on Night Photography by Cheryl Kerr. Cheryl is an accomplished nature, landscape, and night photographer.

An introduction to Night Photography that includes the various, generally recognized major themes of the Night Photography genre; Landscape, Astrophotography, Streetscape/Cityscape, (Portraits) and Light Painting. It includes general or basic information necessary to begin photographing in the night for beginners through

advanced skill sets and includes a brief list of technical information necessary to select the correct settings based on Time, Aperture and ISO (light sensitivity) to take a successful night image. I also include a list of computer processing programs used to process an image, and review techniques used to create complex images, tools needed to create various types of night photography images and resources for additional learning. I plan to have photography equipment set up in the meeting room for a simple tripod setup and a tracker setup to help visualize various methods used to create Astro, City/Streetscape and Light Painting images. I will also bring light painting tools so people can see what they look like and how easy they can be to make.



### Field Trip - Blackwater NWR



On Saturday March 16 please join the club on a field trip to the Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge (NWR).

Blackwater is located on Maryland's Eastern Shore, attracts a vast number of waterfowl. While primarily a tidal marsh, the refuge also includes a mature pine forest. The NWR preserves over 26,000 acres as a wintering area for vast numbers of migratory birds. The most notable bird species that attracts birders from states away are the tundra swans that can be seen by the thousands in the winter months.


Visit the <u>Wildlife Refuge's website</u> to see a month, by month calendar of wildlife species that can be seen on the property.

There is a good chance of seeing many types of birds including bald eagles and owls. Additionally you may see foxes, otters, snakes, frogs, muskrat, racoons, owls, etc. The refuge is approximately a two hour drive from Severna Park. Sunrise will be around 7:13AM. The Visitor Center hours are 10am - 4pm. Wildlife Drive and outdoor facilities are open daily, dawn to dusk, year round. A daily permit is required for all visitors to the Wildlife Drive. Private Vehicle - \$3.00.

# Program - James Corbett - Iceland & Beyond



Please join us on Thursday 21 March at 7:00PM at the Severna Park Baptist Church or on FaceBook Live for a program by James Corbett titled "Making Travel Magic: Iceland and Beyond."

He will inspire you with insights and techniques gained from years of traveling and creating images worthy of competitions, exhibitions, and art sales. His recent 2,661 miles drive around Iceland's ring road gave him ample opportunity to find artistic possibilities. The weather, sun cycle, geography and other challenges required that he

adapt quickly to capture epic moments. He will share what's in his bag and explain key techniques such as selecting lenses, deploying filters, and applying creative techniques. For attendees of the session, James will share some discount links for many of his favorite products (with no financial benefit to him).

James is recognized by the Professional Photographers of America (PPA) as a Master Photographer\*, Photographic Craftsman\*\* and Certified Professional Photographer (CPP)\*\*\*, as well as an Associate and Photographic Fellow of the Maryland Professional Photographers Association (MDPPA). He has participated in photographic competitions at the local, state, district, and international levels every year since 2014. His works are regularly on display in gallery shows in the Washington, DC metro area and he sells his work at select annual art festivals. James has been published in a number of magazines including a feature page in the January 2023 issue of Professional Photographer. He serves as treasurer of the MDPPA and is an active member of PPA, North Bethesda Camera Club, and American Society of Photographers.

The focus is on capturing the vibrant cityscapes, starry skies, or moonlit landscapes to celebrate the unique characteristics of nighttime environments.









#### **Meeting Nights**

Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
