





Field Trip: Skyline Drive



Join the club on a field trip to <u>Skyline Drive Shenandoah National Park</u>. In early October, be on the lookout for fall colors which develop above 3,500 feet as well as white-tailed deer, bears, chipmunks, skunks, and other wildlife.

Directions

Start at Royal Entrance Station – Most northern entrance (Mile 0.6), accessible via U.S. 340 (5 minutes from the town of Front Royal). Travel west on I-66 to Front Royal, Virginia. Exit to Route 340 South, and follow signs for Shenandoah National Park and Skyline Drive. Two-hour drive from Severna Park Baptist Church.

Drive down Skyline Drive enjoying the scenic overlooks for approximately 1.5 hrs 50 miles.

Meet at Big Meadows Harry F. Byrd Sr. Visitors Center 12 Noon.

The drive home from Big Meadows is approximately 3 hrs 142 miles.

Entrance Fees

\$30/car. Free if you have an America the Beautiful or Senior Pass

If you enter the park in a motorized vehicle, your entrance pass covers both you and your passengers. Your passengers do not need a separate pass.

Lunch

Bring a bag lunch.

You can also get lunch at the <u>Big Meadows Wayside</u>. There Blackberry Cobbler a la Mode is a real treat.


Also, if you know anyone who wants to get their portrait taken, ask them to come and be our models! Club members will also serve as volunteer models. Again let us know.

2024-2025 Contest Themes

October - Light and Shadow: This theme emphasizes the use of dynamic lighting, and by extension shadows to create mood and composition. It is not about the source of light, but rather its effect. Examples may include but are not limited to beams of light in dust, broken light filtering through trees or window blinds, "Rembrandt" portrait lighting, and the shadows they create. The shadows created should also be a considered subject. Click here for examples of Light and Shadow. photography.

December - Autumn: The autumn season is a season full of color, and change. Images should capture the essence of autumn: trees turning color, fall festivals, pumpkins, changing weather, etc. Images may focus on the natural aspect of the turning of seasons, or the human and cultural aspects of the season. Click here for examples of <u>Autumn photographs</u>.

February - Geometric Photography: Uses lines, shapes, and patterns found in the world to create interesting compositions, balance and symmetry. The focus of the resulting images will be on the geometric lines, shapes and patterns formed; and the geometric aspect should be clearly conveyed. Subject matter may include, but is not

limited to, Architectural, Urban, and Natural patterns. While there may be a sense of the abstract to this type of image, it is not a required component. There may also be a strong sense of repeating patterns, but this is also not required. The object is to "see" geometric shapes in the environment around you. Click here for examples of Geometric photography.

April - Landscapes: Photographs of land, water, clouds or a combination of these in the outside environment. The image should not be a closeup. An image of a single tree, flower, or building is not a landscape. But a photograph of a forest or field of flowers is. A landscape photograph may include people, man made objects and wildlife but these should complement the scene as a whole and not be the primary subject of the photograph. 










Meeting Nights

The Arundel Camera Club, Inc. meets every Thursday evening from 7:00 PM until 9:00 PM at <u>Severna Park Baptist Church</u>. Setup starts at 6:30 PM. We broadcast our live meetings to <u>FaceBook</u>.

Meetings are open to the public, but only dues paying members may enter competitions and participate in critiques.

Meetings alternate between programs of informative speakers, photographic assignments, and photographic competitions.

Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
