## **End of Year Competition**

BRING IN YOUR WINNING 1st THROUGH 4th PLACE PRINTS FOR THE END OF YEAR CONTEST. ALL PRINTS MUST BE RECEIVED BY APRIL 24th.

Any photograph which has won 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th place in a monthly contest is eligible to be entered in the year-end judging of that program year in the class in which it was originally entered, regardless of the contestant's current class standing. It shall be the responsibility of the maker to return any eligible photograph to the Contest Chairman for the year-end judging.

The year-end competitions will be held off site on April 28th and general attendance by club members will not be allowed. Typically, three judges will be used to judge the year-end competition. Voting shall be done electronically using the club voting box.

No reprints will be allowed in the year-end contest. Thus, the maker should take precautions to ensure the preservation of the original photograph if they wish to enter the picture in exhibitions or competitions outside the

club and fears the original may be damaged in the process.

Based on the final year-end judging, awards will be presented as follows:

 ALL CLASSES (color and monochrome prints and digital imagery): 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th in each class, 10% Honorable Mentions.

From among all the 1st place winners of the year-end judging a single Photograph of the Year shall be chosen as the Best Photograph of the Year.

The member accruing the highest total points in a category (monochrome, color, digital) shall receive the following Photographer of the Year Awards:

- Monochrome, Color, and Digital Photographers of the Year for both Novice and Unlimited.
- Novice Photographer of the Year
- Unlimited Photographer of the Year

The end of year competition awards will be awarded at the yearly club banquet on May 29th.

## Contest - Digital - Club Events



Don't forget that the club events contest is May 8th.

There will be a Novice and an Unlimited category. You may submit one color and one monochrome digital image from each club event you attended during the club year. This will only be digital. No prints. All submitted images shall be judged regardless of the number of submissions.

Club events include any field trip, meeting, gathering, tabletop night, portrait night, photowalk, fundraisers, meet & shoots, the summer picnic, the Christmas party, campfires, exhibits, and last year's club banquet.

Two "Best in show" awards are made: Novice and Unlimited. Each award wins free club membership.

Go back through your files from the 2024-2025 club year and pull out your favorite photos from all the club events.

Remember, you can submit all photos that comply with the rules above, including those you submitted and/or won with in monthly contests.



Lester Picker (<u>www.lesterpickerphoto.com</u>) has more than 650 writing and photo credits in *National Geographic Society publications*, *Better Homes & Gardens*, *Forbes*, *Time, Inc. Publications*, *Money*, *Fortune Small Business*, *Bloomberg Personal Finance*, *National Parks Magazine*, and dozens of newspapers, magazines and other publications. He is a former reporter, photojournalist and editor.

For four years Les was a weekly spot-syndicated columnist for *The Baltimore Sun* and a freelance feature travel writer/photographer.

He offers photography workshops in his studio and leads tours throughout the world. Les' 234-page <u>Travel Photography eBook</u> is available from his website.

Les' landscape and wildlife images decorate many homes, offices and institutions throughout North America. He was honored as the exclusive artist for a major teaching hospital's medical wing, where more than 60 of his large format images are permanently displayed.

Les won the prestigious Canada Northern Lights Award for Best Travel Photography. He is a Moab Master Photographer an Awagami International Ambassador and a former X-Rite Coloratti.

Les has a doctorate in ecology from the University of Maine.

Don't miss the daily noon formation (weather permitting during the academic year). On parade days, you can also wander over to Worden Field by 4:00 p.m. to watch the full Brigade of Midshipmen perform.

## **Business Meeting**

On May 22 we will host our business meeting to elect officers, discuss changes to our contest rules, discuss dues, and select themes for next year's contests.

To prepare for the Annual Meeting, the Board of Directors shall meet no later than two (2) weeks prior to the May Annual Meeting. Attendance of one-third (1/3) of the membership in good standing shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business at any regular Club meeting and is required for the commencement of the Annual Business Meeting.

**Elections -** According to our constitution, when the Annual Business Meeting falls on an odd numbered year (ex.: 1999) the following Officers shall be elected: the Program Chair, the Secretary-Treasurer, and the first Member-at-Large.

Not less than ninety (90)days before the Annual Business Meeting the President shall appoint a Nomination-Election Committee Chair whose duty shall be to assemble a team of at least three (3) members whose duty shall be to submit to the Club the names of members it feels are qualified to hold and fill the various offices no later than the first meeting in April. Talk to Cathy Hockel if you are interested in running for office or assisting on one of the committees.

**Budget and Dues -** Our club treasury will give a report on the club's financials, assets, liabilities, and we will discuss changes to the dues if necessary.

**Contest Themes -** Doug Wood is leading the effort to brainstorm and discuss and themes. He will poll the membership to narrow down the choices. These will be presented at the business meeting for discussion and vote.

Contest Rules - Not less than one hundred twenty (120) days prior to Annual Business Meeting of odd numbered years (1999) the Secretary-Treasurer, in cooperation with the Contest Chair shall assemble a team of not less than three (3) additional members in good standing whose duty shall be to review the Arundel Camera Club Contest Rules, take suggestions from the membership for revisions or updates to said Rules. The Secretary-Treasurer and Contest Chair shall, in their capacity as Co-Chairs of this Committee, compile a report of the findings for presentation to the Board prior to the Annual Business Meeting for consideration/inclusion in the Annual Business Meeting agenda.

**Audit Committee** - Not less than thirty (30) days before the Annual Business Meeting of each year the President shall appoint an Audit Committee Chair, who shall assemble a team of three members whose duty it shall be to audit/review the accounts of the Club and report their findings at the Annual Business Meeting of the Club, after which the committee will dissolve.





Competitions give us a chance to show off our work and to get constructive critiques from our judges. Ribbons are awarded for first through fourth place and honorable mention. Normally we have competitions for color prints, monochrome prints, and digital images. In addition to digital contests, we have restarted our print contests. Competitions are held for both novice and unlimited club members. Awards are awarded at the end of year banquet.

The club also has monthly photographic field trips to locations of interest. This is a chance to go out and practice what we learned during programs, a time to socialize with other club members, and a chance to do a little photographic exploration.
